

Processing Costs Influence Collection Rates.

- Convert existing processing facility to handle single stream collection.
- Transfer single stream recyclables to an existing single stream facility.
- Compare the above with weekly and every other week collection.

Selected Rate Impacts of Alternatives



Curbside COG	\$3.62/mo	\$4.44/mo	\$3.35/mo	\$5.85/mo	\$4.76/mo
Curbside Borough	\$2.55/mo	\$3.66/mo	\$2.89/mo	\$5.03/mo	\$4.26/mo
Curbside Other	\$3.25/mo	\$4.18/mo	\$3.20/mo	\$5.58/mo	\$4.61/mo
Processing	[1]	\$90/ton	\$90/ton	\$154/ton	\$154/ton

With conversion, the only alternative with a financial savings is every other week collection.

Contamination Considerations


- Former Collection Focus > Eventual Market Effect > Processing Focus
- SS > 15-30% Contamination = landfilling 2-3 stops out of every 10
- MSW recent findings:
 - ✓ CT SS MRFs 18%
 - ✓ FL SS MRF 30%
 - ✓ Mid-Atlantic MRFs 20%





Why NOT Single Stream Collection?

- Studies show that expanding to single stream collection could result in 400-450 lbs per household.
- Most Centre County municipalities are already over 490lbs/hh/yr.
- Anticipated drop in marketable recyclables due to increased contamination.
- Fleet conversion costs.
- Possible reduction in material types and tonnages (glass).
- Current contamination rates of nearly 0% expected to increase to 20%.
- Anticipated capital costs and potential contamination outweigh benefits.
